Mary Ellen Chamberlin Awarded 2017 Founders Award

The annual Women Leaders in Gaming Founders Award recognizes a deserving woman who has demonstrated a strong, dedicated commitment and has made a significant impact working within Iowa's gaming industry.

Mary Ellen Chamberlin was a significant force in the very beginning of getting legislation approved to allow riverboat gambling. She then secured enough signatures to pass the county referendum vote to open one of the first riverboat casinos in the country, and became the first executive director of a nonprofit license holder. Her work has made lasting, positive community impacts and played a major role in awarding hundreds of grants over two decades.
